Prof. Kiarie Mwaura is the County Executive Committee Member for Finance and Economic Planning at the Murang'a County Government, Fellow of the Institute Certified Secretaries (ICS), and the immediate former dean of the University of Nairobi's School of Law, where he is a professor of corporate law. He is also a certified governance auditor, who has published widely in the area of corporate governance and corporate law and has served on the boards of the Transport Licensing Appeals Board and National Council for Law Reporting.

Previously, he has worked as the Vice Chancellor of Riara University and as Director of the International Erasmus (European Exchange) Programme at Queen's University Belfast, where he was the first law lecturer of African descent between 2002 and 2009. Before joining Queen's, he worked as a visiting lecturer at the University of Wolverhampton. His expertise in corporate law and governance has seen him serve as: the Founding Editor in Chief of the Governance Journal, which is the only key journal on corporate governance in Africa; Visiting Fellow at both the Harvard Law School's Human Rights Program and the University of Washington; and an expert researcher for the International Commission of Jurists' Expert Legal Panel on Corporate Complicity in International Crimes.

He has served as a consultant on corporate governance for a variety of local and international organizations, including: Safaricom; BAT; Kenya Power and Lighting; Kenya Reinsurance; Nairobi Hospital; Energy and Petroleum Regulatory Authority; Cooperative University; Law Society of Kenya; Financial Sector Deepening Trust (FSD); Savings and

Credit Cooperative Societies Regulatory Authority (SASRA); Institute of Directors; Institute of Certified Secretaries; Kenya Accountants and Secretaries National Examination Board (KASNEB); Strathmore Board of Trustees; Champions of Governance Award; and Training and Consultant Associates (TCA).

He is a Fellow of the UK Higher Education Academy, a Certified Public Secretary (CPS–K), and an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya, who read law at Queen’s University Belfast (Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education Teaching), University of Wolverhampton (PhD), Staffordshire University (LLM), Kenya School of Law (Legal Practice Diploma), University of Nairobi (LLB), and the Canadian Foundation of Administrative Justice (Certificate in Tribunal Administrative Justice).
